School Uniform Policy

Bayswater Primary School has a compulsory uniform policy. This is designed to assist us in developing a positive school tone and image. We aim to promote a strong sense of membership and pride in the school. We also seek to provide an environment in which clothing does not contribute to peer pressure. From a practical and safety standpoint this policy also provides easy identification of children both at school and on school outings.

NEW UNIFORM:

From 2022 all new students enrolling at Bayswater Primary school must wear the new school uniform which consists of aqua and black polo shirt, aqua and black bomber jacket, black track pants, shorts or skort. An optional black shell jacket with school logo is also available for winter. Girls may choose to wear a black, white and aqua school dress. The black school sun-smart bucket hat must be worn during Terms 1 and 4.

Only the school bucket hats are accepted as part of the new school uniform. Other types of hats, including other 'sun-smart' hats will not be allowed at school or during school activities.

Uniform items are available to purchase online through our supplier RH Sports or you can purchase directly from their shop in Ringwood. Non-logo items (ie black track pants, shorts and skorts) may be purchased through other department stores.

During 2022 our old school uniform will be phased out. Students who are attend BPS from 2021 or earlier can continue to wear the old uniform until the end of 2022.

Appropriate footwear must always be worn. While there are no restrictions on style or colour, shoes should be of a sturdy design with suitable ankle and heel support and must have 'closed toes'. These can be leather shoes or runners. No sandals are permitted.

It is essential that all items of clothing are clearly named. A second, less obvious 'name-tag' is a good idea. Lost property that is named will be returned to students. Items that aren't labelled will be held as lost property.

Students who are out of uniform for any reason other than designated 'free dress days' must bring a written note signed by a parent/guardian.
